Overview Of The Campaign Goal

Goal: \$1.1 million over the **next five years**, starting with an initial goal of **\$500,000**.

Purpose: Modernize and renovate the church for another 110 Years. Keep building standing.

Who We Are: Rich history of providing spiritual support, community outreach, and a space for worship and connection in the Diocese of Washington D.C., dating back to 1914.

On 12 September 2024, the Vestry unanimously approved the Capital Improvement Campaign Plan.

Campaign Vision

Modernization and Safety:

Improvements to plumbing, flooring, electrical, sewer, and HVAC systems.


Renovation of Facilities: Focus on restroom renovations, with an emphasis on prioritizing the women's facilities.

Energy Efficiency: Existing solar panels, LED lighting, and future energy-efficient enhancements.

Preservation of History: Maintaining the historic charm of the church while making necessary upgrades.

Phases Of The Campaign

Quiet Phase (Year 1): Engage key donors, church leaders, and influential members to secure initial commitments. Aim to raise 40-50% of the campaign target.

Public Launch (Year

2): Officially announce the campaign, host a kickoff event, and invite participation from the broader community.

Community Engagement (Years 3-4): Organize fundraising events, small group meetings, and provide regular updates through church bulletins and social media.

Closing and Celebration (Year 5):Host a final push for contributions, celebrate campaign success, and recognize donors.


